Great action shot with good contrast and blurred background. Water and surfer captured well with a high shutter speed. I wondered if there should be more space on the left as the board is heading in that direction. but then I also wondered if the extra space should be on the right, and crop the left up to the surf board, as the surfer is falling back into the right hand space. Goes against the 'norms' but might be worth trying.

A great action shot, I would probably have left a little more water below the surfer when cropping the image.

A fast shutter speed and great framing to convey a sense of movement. Might have shown a bit more foreground.

Superb action shot utilising a fast shutter speed to freeze the action which is very effective

Great action shot and the waves and spume are well captured and provide great texture. very good to have caught the very moment the surfer starts to fall.

A great action shot of a surfer riding a wave. Focus and sharpness spot on (which is difficult to achieve with a fast moving object) !

Cool action capture, not just the surfer but the surf! Like the foreground in focus while the 'calm' blue sea has nice background blur - the surfer's left foot looks a little over-photoshoppe/ / unnatural to me?

Lovely milky water. Not sure about the crop as maybe too tall?

The foreground is lovely, the background a little messy perhaps.

Lovely leading line up to the bridge, lots of smooth water and a variety of tones. I would have liked to see a bit more of the bridge.

Nice, pastoral shot, great depth of field too.

Like how you've captured the water. I might have cropped it differently, to show a bit above the bridge (unless it wasn't worth seeing) and crop out the stick at bottom.

A lovely image. Water looks soften with a slow shutter speed. Good tones throughout. Nice to see a vertical letterbox crop. Might help a little to see a fraction more of the top of the bridge. I might have also cropped above the stone and log in the foreground. This would help the eye lead through the image and settle on the bridge. At the moment I'm either looking at the bridge or the stone/log.

I like the subject, and the rock/stick in the foreground gives depth to the picture. I would like to have seen a colour version of this photograph.

Really well framed with the eye drawn from the bottom of the picture up to the bridge I'd hang this on my wall.

Good use of black and white using a a slow shutter speed giving an ethereal effect to the water which has been nicely captured. All the elements within this image are nicely balanced making it pleasing to the eye

Good use of slow shutter speed to create water effects. These work well with the still water providing reflections under the bridge. Interesting textures in the banks and walls. The composition draws you in which is good.

Would it benefit from a bit more contract being black and white?

A great image in black and white. I love the leading lines (rocks) that guide you along the river, past the reflections and under the bridge. I also love how the water is smoothed in the foreground by the use of long exposure.

Nice blurred water effect through long exposure - nicely suited to monochrome - maybe lacks a point of interest for me?; very tight crop above arch of bridge?

Very original and nicely worked. A rather puzzling image and title.

Nice graffiti shot of very popular artwork/artist. Bold colours and good contrast. Would have liked to see more of the wall/environment the graffiti is in.

I'm not sure I understand the title v the image, but it's certainly making me look.

Clever interpretation and very nicely done.

Hmm. Is this the right image?

A very arresting image with the complementary colours (tears for Ukraine?) and the reflection in the pupil. It's always difficult when photographing artwork to give it context. Perhaps a figure walking past? That would let me know the scale and perhaps the location of the artwork. I would also need the title to be explained.

A classic shot of My Dog Sighs Ukrainian Eye, I like the sharpness of the colours and the 'wetness' of the tear meets the brief in an unusual way.

Reminds me of my psychedelic youth. Lovely composition, terrific colours, and detail. Not a lot else to say

Well seen and framed wall art makes this image very intriguing.

Very evocative image, but is it the subject rather than the quality go the photograph which is effective? As a photograph does it need something else?

A powerful example of urban street art in support of Ukraine. I love the striking bold colours which 'pop' against the black background. I also love the fact that the paint has dripped down, adding to the 'wet' theme. I great image!

A picture of a picture? Amazing piece of original graffiti art? Or do we have a Photoshop genius in our midst? The colours and 3-D appearance make the image POP! I'm not sure I'd hang it on my wall at home but it would make me stop and look in an exhibition.

I like the people in the top right and how the foilage is punchy. The fountain is a bit in/out of the picture so unsure about that bit.

The people in the background make this shot.

Too bright.

Good detail on the lilypads, some good reflections from the water fountain & trees, and I like the people talking on the bench. A lot to see in this photo.

Serene image, lovely colour palette and texture

Painterly look, nice feel.

This is a great image, it tells the story of a relaxed warm summers day. I am not bothered at all that areas of the water are burnt out. It might be worth trying a crop to take out the water below the lillys. Being really picky could you have found an angle to include the left side of the fountain and still get the two figures in?

Like the haze from the fountain and how it frames the people chatting.

Almost dream life as well as park life. The misty water and reflections work well. I like the two people on the bench in the top corner. Make for an interesting composition.

I like the sharpness of the lily leaves, the balance of the people with the waterfall and the mist of the water spray making the other parts of the photo seem less important.

I like the composition with the water Lillies towards the bottom third of the frame and the people in the top right-hand corner.

I might have cropped out a part of the bottom of the frame a little.

The people in the top left creates a story to the image for the viewer to contemplate. Perhaps crop a bit of the base, just below the waterlilies to create a panoramic effect

This image has so much interest that it draws you in. The lilies and their colour/texture create a good central feature, together with the reflective water at the bottom, the sparkling water behind, haze from the fountain all serve to create interesting textures and contrast. This is well set off by the people chatting in the corner.

Almost a picture within a picture. I love that the water spray stops to reveal the guys engaged in conversation on the bench. Also lovely vibrant lily leaves and reflections. A nice shot !

I wonder if the girl could be made a little more prominent?

This is really well seen and I like it a lot. I think the author framed this to include the lovely colours in the top left. I wonder if a tighter crop just around the girl might make a different but pleasing image. It might be worth trying to increase the brightness and perhaps the saturation of the just the girl slightly. I think I would twist the whole image slightly to make the line next to the girl completly vertical.

Great storytelling, love the light shining top left, and the texture of the water and the reflections

Another strong graphical image. Water streaks look good and the metallic walls of the fountain are well detailed. The little girl could be brightened a little as she is the main focus of the image. Her reflection is also interesting. I'd want to straighten the vertical lines too.

I love this picture, as well as 'wet' it shows an inquisitive girl, anonymous because of the waterfall distorting the reflection, a great subject.

Love the reflection of the little girl with good framing Maybe I'd have straightened the image

Good positioning of girl in frame giving a sense of scale. Interesting shapes and colours within the well captured running water. Perhaps try cropping concentrating on the girl and refection which would create a different type of image in addition to this one which you intended

The light, colours and texture of the water work really well.

Would the composition be better to concentrate on the girl and her refection? Currently you eye is drawn to the golden reflective water on the top left.

I love the vibrant golden tones, the colourful reflections of the people and the water ripples which give this an almost abstract effect. I think by straightening the vertical lines ever so slightly would have perfected the image overall.

A fun day out with friends, a lovely image to capture a memory. I like the b&w as it keeps your focus on the subjects. Good use of the rule of thirds.

To improve, I would have cropped just to have the subjects and the rocks.

Nicely done, great pose and framing. I think the girls would benefit from lighter shadows.

What a fun image, great timing. I think it works really well in mono. I'm not sure the sky adds much to the image, it might be worth trying a crop just above the line of rocks above their heads. It looks like the image has been exposed for the sea which leave the figures a little dark. It would be worth trying to lighten the figures, either by increasing the exposure of the whole image, or selecting the figures and increasing their exposure (or both!)

Love this their expression on their face great storytelling. And the composition, the use of negative space and captured the people in the bottom third works so well.

Good to see a B&W image. Reminds me of my family beach trips when I was a lad. The figures are all a little dark and it would help the image if they could be lightened, as it would draw the eye to the main subject. It's always best to check horizons are level and also in this case a little bowed through lens distortion. They can both be easily corrected in software. I like the composition as it has various lines that lead you through the image.

Nice image, I like the leading line of the rocks, the black and white makes this look colder than I suspect it was. I might have lifted the shadows slightly, particularly on the male.

Think this looks really good in black and white, with the three swimmers ideally placed in the frame.

Maybe a bit of a lift in the shadows, especially the faces of the two girls to the left of the group,

Good use of the rule of thirds with the odd number of three figures on a diagonal. All works well together. I think I would have brought out a little more detail in the shadow areas. Maybe lighten the faces.

This photo really conveys the essence of swimming in the cold and wet, together with the fun these women are having which is great. It draws you in wondering why the central figure is reacting as she is. I think that the composition works with the people in the bottom right and the waves and sky occupying the rest.

I wonder if lightening the faces of the people would bring them out, but not taking away from the contrast through the rest of the picture?

A bit of fun shot. I don't know what to say really. Horizon not quite level, and vignette a little too heavy in the sky areas. I've never seen this character on the beach at Southerndown before. I'll keep a look out next time I'm down there. :)

A good fun shot, I think the size of the drops on the figure are out of proportion to the droplets from the sea which looks a bit odd..... not that a yellow figure emerging from the sea isn't odd enough!

Terrific, makes me smile every time I see it. lovely framing, with a great vignette showing up the rocks at the bottom of the feet. Nothing else to add.

Vignetting helps draw the eye to the main brightly coloured subject matter in this very humourous image.

Amusing image. The focus on the figure would benefit from being sharper. there is some unexplained light in the centre of the rocks.

Are they releasing radioactive stuff into the Channel that brings you out in large water blisters and makes you go yellow and stretchy? Yikes [©] A great example of post production editing - it did make me chuckle !!

Excellently meets the subject, very well done.

Nice fun shot. Composition might have been improved with either more of the bottom to see more reflection, or tighter.

Looks like an effective ballboy (or girl).

A good action & reflection shot, with a very cute subject. I like the detail captured in the dog's coat (especially the tail) and the circle of water...

To improve it could be zoomed out (if possible) to see the full ring of water and allow the use of the rule of thirds better. Also a bit of smoothing on the reflection to make it clearer.

Nicely caught, good timing and great impact.

great shot, sharp and with a speed to freeze the water. love the catchlight in the eyes. I wonder if you had the whole of the refelection in the shot and including that might have worked. Alternativly you could try cropping of some of the bottom, say halfway up the reflection. Being really picky, you could try lightening the nose and ball slightly. Also it might be worth seeing what it looks like in balck and white

He looks happy, love how you've captured the splashing through water. I may have zoomed out a bit to get the whole of the dogs reflection.

A fun shot. Water movement is frozen well. One ear up and one down is fun. Is there anymore of the foreground reflection?

Nice shot, great freeze motion. I think I might have cropped slightly differently, with the dog a little further down the frame.

Very sharp, with highlights in the eyes caught perfectly. Also caught the water frozen just at the right time.

May have cropped to place the dog in the centre of the frame.

Good action shot with the dog nicely placed in the frame, sharp where it needs to be and keeping the reflection in adds to this image

The reflection in the foreground, combined with the ripples in the centre and the droplets are a good combination.

For a picture with such movement however it feels a bit flat, maybe due to the colours/contrast?

What fun he/she is having! You have captured that perfectly here. I love how the water has been 'frozen' in time around the dog. I think that I would have cropped the bottom of the image so that the focus was more on the water splashes area rather than the reflection of the dog.

Man's best friend attributes captured, action frozen, plenty of texture - lacks some detail in the eyes although nose and mouth in focus - maybe needs more D-O-F?

Love the patterns and abstract feeling. A bit dark - would be interesting to see it with a boost of light.

A less glamorous expression of wetness.

I like this photo as it has lots of texture, layers, and geometric shapes making it interesting. The water is rough but also smooth on the edges giving the illusion of dense smoke/fog. This photo could be cropped slightly to improve visual appeal.

I wonder if it would have more impact if converted to monochrome.

A great image, I love the effect. The colour emphsises the two different elements but I wonder if it's worth trying it in mono to see how that looks. I'm not sure that the water in the bottom sections adds anything, might be worth trying a crop at the point where the diagonal meets the edge of the frame. As a crazy thought you could try turning the image upside down or sideways to make it even more abstract

Good leading lines and diagonals make this image. Not just an image of moving water but also of line and shape. Contrast and highlights could be increased a little to bring out the texture in the water. You could also consider B&W?

I like the composition and flow of the water. I feel a slower shutter speed might have added to the effect

Very simple image creating an almost abstract image creating diagonal lines drawing us into the picture

The angles and planes work well. The texture created by the fast shutter speed is very effective. The colours are muted and attractive.

Does the picture need something else in it to set it off?

I love that the steps lead you diagonally to the top of the image (great leading lines) and the effect of the water, which seems to go in two different directions. I just wonder whether it could have been cropped slightly more so that the diagonal line cuts the image equally into two?

Like the repetition & leading lines, pleasing crop / composition, good contrast between highlights and shadows - no real suggestions on how to improve but, not sure it 'grabs' me enough to be in my top 3

A few ideas for next time Maybe be a bit more creative with even more of a tonal contrast and make the veins show a little, or apply a grunge/drama filter...

Lovely close up. Side lit, textural.

A little burnt out in the highlights, great detail and framing though.

Love this, what a great image. The focus is good and the droplets are fantastic. I like the crop which works really well. Only suggestion would be to reduce the expousure very slightly around the central area and perhaps the lower white leaf. It might also be worth trying boosting the saturation of the whole image very slightly

Lovely macro shot, the water droplets are crystal clear.

A very romantic image. Water droplets have been captured well and exposure handled well. It might be just the compressed image on here, but the foreground is a little soft. That might have been intentional. Comments are always subjective. A little soft vignette right in the corners might be worth considering.

I like this, however in order to give some feed back, I think I would like to see slightly more of the rose.

Lovely detail in the rose and water droplets. The rose stands out against the black background. Maybe show a bit more of the rose if possible.

Good, sharp macro shot with minimal colour emphasizing the water droplets which stand out really well

A picture perfect rose with the pastel colours being enhanced by the black background. The water drops add to the delicate effect. I like that the image is zoomed/cropped and that the centre of the rose is just off-centre. Well done !

A very graphical image. I'd like to know how it was achieved. It has a very painterly, watercolour feel to it. Perhaps the highlight in the actual tear could be brightened a little to make it look more like water as this would draw you into the subject of the image. Very unusual and interesting image.

I'm in two minds with this shot, firstly I think the composition of the eye, tears and water stained painting is clever and definitely meets the criteria of 'wet' in a number of ways, however the picture is more like a drawing than a photograph.

A lot of work I think, and time well spent I had to look carefully to understand the image

Intriguing creative panoramic with minimal colour making for a good graphic type of image

A powerful shot. Tricky on composition - want to show the spray on top left but dont really want the dark/fences on the bottom left. I like the grain also.

Captured very well, though I'm not certain about the colouring.

I really like this photo. Great texture from the rough waves, to the soft spray. Colours are quite flat, maybe a b&w or higher contrast would make this photo pop.

Nicely captured, maybe a bit more 'bite' would give it more impact

Porthcawl on a windy day, never disapoints, a fine image. It might be worth trying a crop to remove both metal fences on the left. The image seems a tad dark, I wonder if nudging up the expousure of the whole image, and perhaps a bit more just on the stone wall/ramp in the front left might work better. Also worth having a look to see how it would work in mono

A good atmospheric shot. Perhaps make it a full B&W image as I'm not sure whether there is any colour there or not. I'd crop in on the left a little and increase the highlights to make it even more dramatic.

I think I would like to have seen a sharper picture, and cropped a little differently to take away the fencing on the left hand side of the shot and possibly a little more of the foreground.

A sepia-toned print and it works well with the subject. Love the movement of the water. Not much wrong, maybe I'd crop it a little on the left-hand side.

Good tonal range, darkening around the edges giving more emphasise and drawing the eye to the shape of the waves and light house . Good example of the capture of the decisive moment

Great subject. The waves caught so well and gives a great feeling of movement. Interesting colours in the sky.

Perhaps would benefit from slight cropping in the left, the railings don't add to the picture but the darkness and texture of the harbour wall does provide a good composition.

A great capture of the infamous lighthouse at Porthcawl on a stormy day. The only thing that I might have done differently would be to crop the image slightly on the lefthand side to remove the metal barriers.

Image captures the drama of the storm very effectively, although perhaps a little too 'noisy' for my liking

Very nice positioning of the fisherman and great colour. I am not sure if the spray is adding or distracting. Is that horizon straight?

Good idea. I think it may have been more effective with fewer water drops.

I like the composition of this photo, and the light vignette brightens it up without over brightening the whole photo.

I love how the rocks and steps break up the blues nicely. Is that sea foam flying around or huge spray? I like it though, looks like a painting!

To improve I would crop to put more emphasis on the subject and use the rule of thirds ... but as a whole photo it works with many areas of interest, not just a fisherman.

Maybe consider a tighter crop to remove the two bright bits of white water.

A good image and well seen, I like the water splashes. I wonder if a slightly tighter crop to make the figure more promenent might work.

Quite a dramatic image. The spray has been captured well, and I wonder how safe the fisherman is. The horizon is not level and runs almost straight through the middle of the image. I'd perhaps crop out at least half the sky.

I like the way the spray adds depth to the photo, nice composition and colour.

The good feeling of he's going to get wet, and well-framed Horizon doesn't look straight to me.

A different approach to this image of a fisherman to include water spray adds to the interest. Perhaps cropping the sky would make it less of a 50/50% split between sky and sea

The composition works well with the manmade steps creating an interesting feature in the otherwise natural setting. The position of the horizon works well with the figure.

The colours and light work well together.

I couldn't understand how the splashes cover the whole picture?

I can just imagine myself sitting there in the sun watching the ocean and the sea spray. Beautiful ocean colours and composition. Not sure that vignette is needed on this occasion?

The ocean spray gives a virtual 'Christmas scene', intriguing as to the story - what is the guy thinking about as he casts his line?

Fits the bill, very central subject could it have included a bit more grass to the left and above?

I like the colours and the lighting. Looks a bit soft in places.

Simple and effective

Nice drops captured, variety of colours and textures. A little too bright in places. Would have benefitted from being a macro style shot zoomed in on the leaf to see more of the structural details as well as the water droplets.

Very natural looking lovely light and shade, texture.

Great capture, maybe reduce saturation in the green?

Great subject and perfect for the theme. I wonder if a different crop, either to just have the leaf and droplets, or wider to show a lttle more around either end of the leaf might work better. The grass is a little bright at the bottom, it would be worth considering reducing the brightness there and perhaps boosting the darker section of the leaf as well.

Strong lies and diagonals and the water droplets are caught well. A little bright on the edges and in the green areas. A vignette would help to darken these area.

I like the colours and subject. I find the shadows on the leaf from something outside the shot a little distracting and also the leave just creeping into the right hand side of the shot is also a bit distracting.

Amazing detail, lovely colours, and framing May have lifted the shadows a little, and dropped the highlights.

Good sharp image on the diagonal showing harmonious colours emphasizing the water droplets.

Fits the brief and the water droplets are lit nicely.

However the composition would benefit from reconsideration to create a more interesting image.

I love how the sunlight illuminates the raindrops and creates areas of light and shade on the leaf. I think I would crop the image further to focus more on the raindrops and leaf and use a vignette to mask out some of the green grass.

Simple but effective interpretation; Nice tight crop & leaf detail. Maybe missed an opportunity

Great idea and fits the bill. I hope the camera man got wet too!

Made me smile. Maybe a little bit more light in the dogs face would have made it easier to see the expression.

Well caught, though a bit underexposed.

Fun shot, I love how gangly the dog looks during a shake down. Good use of the rule of thirds and capturing lots of texture from the gritty wet sand, tiny spray, and waves crashing in the background.

Making it B&W with a vignette could have added to this image. Keep focus on the eyes of the subject to get clearer focus on the face (could just be the resolution on forms).

Consider lightening the shadow area of the dog.

I really like the movement in this image and the camera position at dog height with him central is perfect. The sea and waves give great context but I think the small area of sky is a bit distracting and I would be tempted to crop that out. I think increasing the expousure around the dog's face would be worth a try

A very wet dog, so fits the brief well. Background is nicely blurred. I would like to see a little more detail in the dog. Its face could do with lightening. I'd also crop out the little bit of sky on the horizon.

Well done for catching the dog at just the right moment. He/She is looking at the camera, eyes open and without droplets obscuring his face. I don't know if this is luck or careful use of editing software but it works well. Its a pity that the image isn't a bit sharper though.

Well composed with the dogs head nice and sharp surrounded by spray, Maybe would have cropped the image a little to make the dog more prominent.

An unrepeatable moment captured in time. Perhaps choose a day when the lighting is kinder to show more detail in the dogs face. Well worth pursuing

Good idea but the shutter speed should have been faster as the dogs face is blurred. The dogs head would have been interesting but it's legs don't add to the image.

Another dog having fun in the water! I love the way that the water drops demonstrates movement of the dog shaking. Maybe a slight crop required to enhance the overall composition?

Fast shutter speed has 'frozen' the action effectively together with the water droplets- possible a wider aperture setting may have lifted the exposure and detail in the dog's face? Hope you

This is nice, I like the colour and the water droplets, I think it would have been better with a bit more depth of field so that the centre of the rose was also in focus.

Outstanding detail in the rose, sharp with a dark background and blurred stem. Not a lot else to say.

great idea and contrasting textures of the frogspawn and the brown foliage. The refection on the frogspawn creates a nice light and feature, however the unfocussed top of the picture doesn't add anything, particularly the purple patches

I love the green earthy tones and how the water is creating ripples and patterns between the eggs. I would have taken the vignette out completely and cropped considerably, so that you are left with a stunning abstract effect of the frogspawn and ripples.

Very nicely caught.

This is a great shot and realy well executed. Not sure if it was planned but I can see a scary face in the central swirl of bubbles. Due to the height of the image I coudn't get the whole thing on my screen in one and when I had the just the central area with the 'face' that was awsome. It's currently a very tight crop on the bottle or glass. I wonder if a different crop either wider to show the context of the vessel, or tighter to show just the abstract 'face' might work well

Makes me think of Guinness advert, love it, great in Black and white

A great idea and execution to achieve this image. B&W works well and the whirlpool effect suits the title and the brief. The crop is too tight for me. I'd like to see a little more of the curvature of the bottle. But well done in capturing this, the lighting is great.

Unusual subject. I think it might have been better if the bottle wasn't cropped as much so that you could instantly see that it was a bottle, I'm not keen on the neck of the bottle being cut off. I also think that the line down the centre (seam in the making of the bottle?) is distracting.

Looks good in black & white with the bubbles showing movement spinning. Maybe would have reduced the highlights a little.

Graphic black and white image with the eye following the bubbles down to the base of the bottle, perhaps would have been nice to have an eye stopper point of interest placed there?

Good idea and contrast but is it overcropped and should the shutter speed have been even faster?

A great black and white image of water in a bottle. I love how the lighting has enhanced the outline of the bottle at the top and the vortex all the way down to the bottom. I like this a lot !

Intriguing! I can't stop looking at this image and admiring the Title / Interpretation / Light & shadows. Love it! - Mildly irritating that due to its relative proportions had to zoom out to be able to see the whole image on my laptop screen?

Nice fun shot. I wonder if cropping in to just one of these would have allowed more detail as we feel quite far away.

Very well executed

Nice sporty shot with some details on the subjects. Too much blue, detracting from the main subjects.

To improve (if possible with the resolution) I'd crop and use the first jet ski only, enhance the orange, and reduce the contrast of the sea.

Certainly wet and the colour of the sea is great. Good action and the speed has frozen the water. Often odd numbers work better than even so I wonder if there was a chance to get a single noat leaving a long trail, or 3 boats in a line. If you had time this might have been a good opportunity to try panning

Like the composition the negative space used

Fast and wet. I'd go for an even tighter letterbox crop to focus down on to the action.

A good subject, might have been better if the subject and photographer were closer to each other (probably not possible though). It would have been better if they were a little sharper.

Good sense of speed, with a well-exposed image. I might have cropped the photo a bit on the left to show both jetskis coming into the frame.

Good positioning of the boats in the image. Perhaps cropping to a panoramic would emphasize the boats more and maybe a bit less colour saturation?

The capture of the water spray work well although not sure the focus is spot on. Not the most interesting composition/subject. Would it have been better to zoom in on one of the jet skiers to get a feeling of an action shot?

You would certainly get very wet with all that spray ! Good use of negative space and I like that the image is predominantly blue with a streak of white spray.

Intrigued by the title - the second boat / ski appears to be going faster / chasing the first? Is the driver furious? Are we witnessing 'sea rage' $\stackrel{()}{\Rightarrow}$ Anyway, it's a little distant, may have benefited from a zoom lens with more reach

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
