

Photography Skills

APERTURE (f-stop)

The aperture (f-stop) controls the amount of light reaching the sensor through the lens. The aperture size will regulate the sensor's degree of exposure to light.



APERTURE SCALE




BRIGHTERAllows MORE light in

BLURRED BACKGROUND






