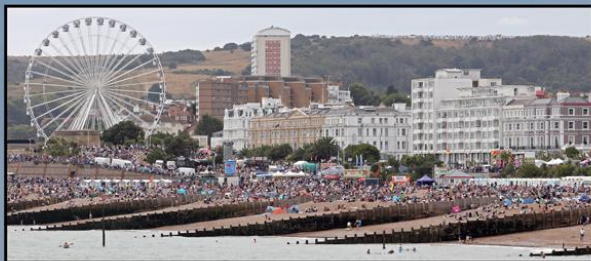

Winchcombe

Winchcombe is steeped in history having a bronze age long barrow, three Roman villas, an abbey and a castle. Its abbey and its castle have attracted pilgrims and royalty over many centuries. The original Sudeley Castle was the home of Queen Katherine Parr, the only surviving wife of Henry VIII. During the Civil War Cromwell's troops ruined the castle, but her marble tomb still stands in St Mary's Church situated in the castle grounds.

In Saxon times Winchcombe was the capital of Mercia and in the Middle Ages the great Abbey, founded in AD798, became our largest landowner. Winchcombe grew rich on the wool trade, fine houses were built and many can still be seen today.

The cottages in Vineyard Street leading down to the River Isbourne, the Jacobean houses; the Victorian almshouses and the passageways between them all add to Winchcombe's charm. We hope you enjoy discovering the pleasures of our town.

Belas Knap long barrow, built around 3000 BC and one of the finest in the county, is on Cleeve Hill beside the Cotswold Way.
